ABOUT THE SYMPOSIUM

The Deep South Center for Environmental Justice (DSCEJ) at Dillard University in New Orleans sponsoring its 2nd national symposium on *Race, Place, and the Environment After Katrina: Reclaiming, Rebuilding, Revitalizing, May 15 – 17, 2008* at the JW Marriott Hotel, 614 Canal St., New Orleans, LA. The symposium will examine the progress of rebuilding efforts in the Gulf Coast with some emphasis on the recovery of the City of New Orleans.
